ICMP Success Bursary 2021/22

Terms and Conditions

What is the ICMP Success Bursary?

1. The ICMP Success Bursary comprises a non-repayable award of £300 per semester to our UK students starting in 2021-22 and our UK-and EU domiciled students, who started in 2020-21, on full-time ICMP degree programmes who submit all their assessments on time.

The bursary is awarded automatically in June 2022 based on successful submission of all assignments. There is no application process, and the scheme is open to all applicants who meet the criteria outlined in section 2.

Eligibility Criteria

2. Students will only be eligible for an award if they meet the following criteria:
 - a. A UK undergraduate student starting study in 2021/22.
 - b. A UK or EU undergraduate student starting their second year of study in 2021/22.
 - c. Receiving Student Finance funding.
 - d. Students who have not applied for Student Finance due to religious reasons.
 - e. Enrolled on a full-time programme on campus at ICMP.

Excludes those:

- a. Studying via online or distance learning.
- b. EU students starting their studies in 2021/22.
- c. Those retaking any year of their studies.
- d. Full-time students who started their course prior to 2020/21.

Application Process

3. There is no application process, the bursary is awarded automatically to all eligible students who submit all their assessments on time in Semester A and Semester B. Eligibility and assessment submission will be checked before payment is processed.
4. Students, who are granted Extenuating Circumstances, for their outstanding non-submissions in Semester A and B, will still be eligible to receive the bursary.

Payment Details

5. The bursary will be paid in one instalment of either £300 or £600 depending on assignment submission, at the end of the academic year by BACS (Bankers Automated Credit System) by Student Finance. The payment will be made in June 2022.
6. Students who have not applied for Student Finance due to religious reasons will be paid in one instalment of either £300 or £600 depending on assignment submission, at the end of the academic year by BACS (Bankers Automated Credit System) by ICMP. The payment will be made in June 2022.
7. The payment will only be paid if students have committed fully with the conditions of admittance, ICMP's regulations including our attendance policy and the student code of conduct.
8. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure that the bank details they provide to Student Finance or ICMP are correct. Incorrect bank details may cause delays in payment. If bank details have not been provided by the end of Semester B, the award may be cancelled without further warning.
9. If you have overdue debt to ICMP, the bursary will be used as a debt relief to any outstanding debts.
10. All information supplied by the applicant as part of their application will be held maintained in accordance with the provision of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

12. The bursary cannot be exchanged for an alternative award.

13. If the student's status changes during their study as a result of information not being provided at the point of application, and the student becomes ineligible, ICMP reserves the right to revoke the bursary and claim back any payments incorrectly made to the recipient.

14. If a student breaks ICMP's regulations and is withdrawn from study, the bursary will be immediately terminated, and no further support will be available. Bursaries paid out will not be reclaimed.
